Overall part 1 les are down 18.4% (from 2014 to where it was 2013). In 5 years Part 1 crimes are down an rall 32%. Part 1 crimes are violent crimes and property crimes. Out of all the Sheriff's ions patrolled by the Los Angeles Sheriff's stations, Altadena reported the greatest drop in les. There are very aggressive crime reduction procedures that the Sheriff's Station is ploying to further reduce crime. What goes into reducing crime is for the community to involved and notify the Sheriff's Department when crime takes place, and greater loyment of Sheriff's Deputies. There are 3 additional Sheriff's Deputies which the dena Sheriff's Station received and for which are being deployed. In December 2014, dena only had 1 strong armed robbery which was solved. 7 residential burglaries of which we been arrested. No vehicle thefts in December 2014.
