The plan calls for a building that is 30 square feet more than the building proposed but has a smaller occupancy - reduced from 46 to 44. Application was filed in 2011, approved in 2012. But, there is a need now to extend the life of the CUP. There is no history of complaints and the facility provides good service to the community. Billy Malone Moves that the Altadena Town Council recommend approval of the CUP 2012-0037, project number R2012; Seconded by J. Bissner- unanimous vote among all Councilmembers. 5. WALKABILITY STUDY UPDATE 5.1 Marge Nicols from Neighbors Building a Better Altadena (NBBA) reports the study was a UCLA Master Project from Justin Robertson (Altadena resident) to rate the blocks among Lincoln and Lake to assess the walkability, safety, and attractiveness of the streets. After investigating 4 possible projects, the Walkability group decided to focus on a project at the corner of Lake and Calaveras and the other at the RITE AID shopping plaza at Lake and Altadena Drive. The Walkability group is proposing to work with the County to address safety, and attractiveness at Lake and Calaveras by making certain specific improvements. The Walkability group is seeking the ATC's support.
