3.	on an up	OF THE STATE ADDRESS Assemblymember Chris Holden reported date on the 2014 Legislative Session. Assemblymember Chris Holden was also appointed to sistant majority floor leader for the state assembly. The major issues addressed were:
	a.	Budget and Economy in terms of recovered jobs lost/current unemployment rate and fiscal
	b.	discipline. AB 1147 (17470 regulating Massage Businesses and SB 628 (Beall and Wolk) Enhanced Infrastructure Financing Districts.
	c.	AB 1672 addressing crime truancy among children; AB 1451 addressing dual enrollment in high school and community college; and AB 1940 STEM Course Access Act to provide advanced placement science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) courses for specific undeserved communities throughout California.
	d.	LCFF (Local Control Funding Formula) Allows local districts to allocate funds to meet the needs of their community and close the achievement gap for students while specifically addressing the needs of foster youth, English as a second language students, and those below the poverty lines.
	e.	AB 1557 which gives veterans a stronger voice in college leadership; SB 955 addresses Human Trafficking – Assemblymember Chris Holden is the co-author of this legislation; and AB 1566 (Kitchen Grease Theft) – gives law enforcement stronger tools to combat this growing problem.
	f.	Assembly Joint Resolution (AJR) 33 – calls on the Department of Defense to set the record straight about sailors from the U.S.S. Frank E. Evans.
	g.	California Drought: 2014 Water Bond with specific funding to ensure safe and accessible water for generations to come.
	h.	California Drought: Wildfires – provides our first responders the necessary budget resources.
	i.	Regional Transportation Solutions – ensuring that the San Gabriel Valley communities have a greater voice in setting transportation priorities.
	j.	Top Priority of Assemblymember Holden is to provide excellent service to obtain the results that the community needs.

In August 2014, there were 269 responses from the local stations. Of the 269 responses, 210 calls were for emergency medical assistance. A "Ready Set Go Guide" is provided to the community to get your home ready in case of fire. Pulse Point is a new program which can be downloaded on your phone to alert a person if someone within 800 feet is having a heart attack.
