3.	3. PUBLIC SAFETY REPORTS				
	p ir o d w a ir m	California Highway Patrol Officer Bejar (Public Information Officer) reports for January 2016. There were 10 traffic collisions (8 were roperty damage only, 3 of those 8 were hit and run and out of the 10 there were 2 with nijuries). 22 citations were issued, 7 verbal warnings and 4 misdemeanor investigations occurred during the month of January 2016. Officer Bejar also reports that CHIPS FOR KIDS id really well this year and Officer Bejar thanks the ATC for its contribution. Over 3,500 toys were collected. April is national distracted month. The community is encouraged not to text and drive or talk on the cell. Officer Bejar discusses the Explorer program which is for addividuals from the ages of 15-21. It helps individuals learn the ropes - those who may want to be in law enforcement in the future. Also, the Senior Volunteer Program — which is comprised of other individuals who are 55 years of age or older who want to colunteer. These persons assist the Officers with public events, installing radar trailers, etc.			
	T tl a 6 y h e p	Altadena Sheriff's Station Captain Vicki tuckey reports that Lt. Phil Marquez has accepted a position at Walnut/Diamond Bar Station. he new Detective Bureau Lt. will be Yolanda Clay. Det. Clay is welcomed. Captain Stuckey nen provides the crime statistics: (a) overall robberies are down 25%, (b) overall aggravated ssaults are down 33%, (c) overall burglaries are up about 16%, (d) overall larceny's are up 9% (e) and overall grand theft autos are up 74%. Regarding the burglaries – this time last ear there were 18 and now its 21. Larceny thefts – this time last year we had 17 and now we ave 39 (5 of which were from Wal-Mart, and 4 were package thefts). Citizens are ncouraged to have things delivered to their home when they are present or have their ackages delivered to their job. Package thefts are on the rise. Also, this time last year 4 ehicles were stolen and now we have 7. The community is encouraged to take their valuable elongings out of their cars when they leave their car.

	4.1	Foothill Municipal Water District Nina Jazmadarian - General Manager – Foothill Municipal Water District – provides imported water to retail agencies in Altadena, La Canada and La Crescenta.		
		4.1.1 Ms. Jazmadarian presents information on the upcoming outside watering restrictions. Customers are being asked to refrain from irrigating lawns from February 23 to March 10, because of limited imported water availability due to replacement of portions of pipelines. This shut down is only for the water companies of La Flores, Rubio Canyon, and Lincoln Avenue. Construction work will be occurring at the intersection of Glenrose Avenue and Figueroa Drive and intersection of Glen Avenue and West Calaveras Street from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Foothill is asking residents to try and avoid those areas. Press releases and signage will come down to inform the community that the water stoppage is over.
