A total of 131 traffic citations given out in Altadena. Thirty-nine of those citations were for speeding, 11 for seat belt violations.

Residential burglaries have increased for the month. Prius automobiles are targeted for their calcilytic convertors. The Captain advised cars be parked in garages.
