The Captain reminded the community to always lock all vehicles and take precautions when having packages delivered to their homes. There was a high number of thefts for the month, a total of 17.

Violent crimes for 2018 were up 33% for 2018. Domestic violent crimes were the biggest increase. Property crimes were done for 2018. Over 5 years crime in Altadena was down 19%.

Captain Stuckley will be retiring in March after 33 years with the Los Angeles County Sheriff Department.

Chairman Ezieme presented Captain Stuckley with a commendation for Sgt. Thomas Crosswhite who is retiring from the Altadena Sheriff station. Captain Stuckley will present it to Sgt. Crosswhite at his upcoming retirement.
