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Councilmember Sanyika share information regarding the Collaborate PASadena meeting of August 28th held at Pacific Oaks College. The meeting was an update on the Student Success Workshop, secondary school attendance and scope of attendance issues.

Councilmember Sanyika reported the 2020 Census was also discussed at the meeting. April 1st is Census Day. This will the first time the census will be available on-line. It is important that everyone participate in taking the census to ensure accurate counts are recorded. Inaccurate counts can lead to redistricting and loss of money for California. California could receive up to \$77M in funding depending on the final census count. Pasadena could receive up to \$18M. Councilmember Sanyika stressed the importance of the census.
