7.1 2020 United States Census ______ Justin Chen, Partnership Specialist, US Census Bureau

Ms. Chen gave an overview of the 2020 Census. It is important that all Altadena citizens participate. Distribution of Federal funding is based on the results of the census. She stressed that it is important that everyone be count. The 2020 census

Census results help determine how billions of dollars in federal funding flow into states and communities each year.

The results determine how many seats in Congress each state gets. All information collected is confidential and cannot be shared.

It's mandated by the U.S. Constitution in Article 1, Section 2: The U.S. has counted its population every 10 years since 1790.

Ms. Romo shared information on two programs offered by the Los Angeles County Community & Economic Development Department. One program offers small business loans from \$20,000 to \$2M. These loans help business to be able to keep their business in Altadena. Businesses can access capital with low interest loans and terms tailored to their needs.

The LACDA has active business façade improvement programs which provide grants and technical services to assist with the improvement of streetscapes along designated commercial corridors in unincorporated communities. The façade programs provide grants that cover all costs associated environmental, design, and construction services. These programs are open to all small businesses in Altadena.

LACDA encourages community development, and empower Los Angeles County residents and business to reach their full potential.
