2.4 Treasurer _____ Jennifer Lee Treasurer Lee reported a balance of \$2,262.40 in the ATC checking account. The account is balanced and in good standing. PUBLIC SAFETY REPORTS 3.1 California Highway Patrol ______ Pat Sutherlen Vice Chair Pat Sutherlen read into the record the California Highway Patrol stats for the month of April. The report 21 crashes, 5 hit and run, no DUIs. There was 4 injury accidents and 14 accidents with property damage only. The number of traffic collisions were down due to less drivers on the road because of the "stay-at-home orders" but speeding was increased due to less traffic. 3.2 Altadena Sheriff's Station ______Capt. Jacobs Capt. Jacobs reported crime for the month is down 13%. Domestic violence was up 8%. There was an increase in crime in census tract 4610 including five break-ins at the 24hour fitness. Three-hundred-forty-two Sheriff personnel were tested for the COVID-19 virus and 54 were found positive. Testing is available to all sheriff personnel. During the current pandemic the focus of the Sheriff's is to be highly visible in the community. 3.3 Altadena Fire Bill Malone Chairman Malone read into record the fire report for the month of March. The Altadena Fire Department responded to a total of 362 calls, 304 medical calls, 14 service calls, 2 hazmat, 7 hazardous conditions and 28 good intent calls. 3.4 CERT ______Bill Malone

A motion was made to approve the minutes of February 18, 2020. A vote was taken and the minutes were approved as presented in final form. Minute will be available on the

web-site.

Chairman Malone reminded everyone that CERT suggests everyone always keep a three-month supply of food, money, water and approximately \$500 in cash in preparation for disasters. The current pandemic is an example of why this is true. CERT will be having a virtual meeting on May 13th from 5:30 p.m.–7:00 p.m.

CERT has been following the development of the pandemic since January. Information on the current pandemic was posted by CERT in January.

Currently there are no Red Cross blood drives due to social distancing. Appointments to donate blood can be made directly with the Red Cross. CERT and Billy Malone are working on a virtual blood drive.

The Street Story app is a community engagement tool that allows residents, community groups and agencies to collect information about transportation collisions, near-misses, general hazards and safe locations to travel. Ms. Lee stressed to the community the importance of participating in 2020 Census. Filling out the census will help our community receive Federal and State funding. Monies received during a disaster is based on information taken from the census. Census results help determine how billions of dollars in federal funding flow into states and communities each year.

Pasadena Unified School District schools closed in late March. Students were set-up with tools to continue classes remotely. PUSD purchased "hot spots" for students without internet service. PUSD continues to serve "grab and go" meals to students and families. Classes continue to be held remotely.
