Slow Streets Program

The Slow Streets Program is part of Los Angeles County's local emergency response to COVID-19.

The program aims to enhance traffic safety and encourage physical activity and community compliance with physical distancing guidelines.

What will a Slow Street Network look like?

A Slow Street Network will have signs posted at key intersections alerting motorists to slow down and be aware of people using the street for physical activity.

Become a Slow Street Ambassador

Responsibilities include:

- Promoting the purpose of the Slow Streets Program to fellow residents.
- Notifying LA County Public Works if the signage or equipment is missing, broken or vandalized.
- Communicating with LA County if physical distancing guidelines are not followed.

Slow Streets Program eligibility requirements

- Streets are residential streets
- Streets are part of a network that includes 10 to 25 intersections or approximately 2 miles
