The rate for positive cases has been reduced from 12% to 5.5%. Hospitalization for the virus is down 37%. Testing capacity is good and continues to decline. The reopening of schools in the class rooms is a priority for the county. The transmission of the virus must continue to go down to ensure reopening of the schools. The virus' financial impact on the County's economy is being considered and reviewed.

Mr. Covey comment on the regulation of leaf blowers, a concern received in a letter to the ATC from Altadena citizen Ann Chomyn. He reported that the County is looking into the regulation of leaf blowers and the effect of such regulations.
