A great chance to get to know your newly elected Census Tract Representative Darrell Aranda and incumbent Veronica Jones!



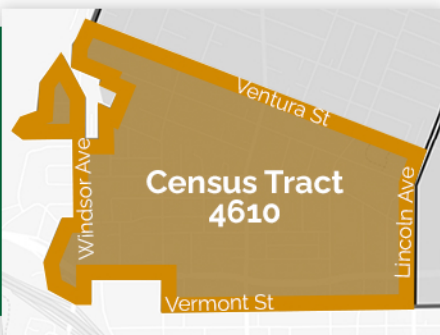

SPARK CURIOSITY & CONNECT *with* NEIGHBORS Host a Community Conversation



What kind of community do you want to live in? What are the needs of our community post-pandemic? What can we do as a community to bring about positive change? In 2021, the Altadena Libraries are launching a series of Community Conversations in homes across Altadena to bring neighbors together to find out. We are seeking community members to host these conversations and bring the voices of Altadena together, one block at a time!

How Does it Work?



Interested hosts in the community work with library staff to identify the date of their Community Conversation to be held virtually or in person at their home (as public health regulations allow).



Library staff provide printed and digital invitations for the host to share with neighbors on their block.



On the day of the event, two library staff will join the group (either virtually or in person) to facilitate the conversation and take notes. Hosts and neighbors get to sit back and enjoy the conversations as participants, as library staff guide the group through the process.



Once the facilitation is done, neighbors are welcome to spend more time together or go their separate ways. It is encouraged that neighbors schedule another check-in sometime soon to keep building relationships and tackle other relevant neighborhood topics, like emergency planning or civic engagement!

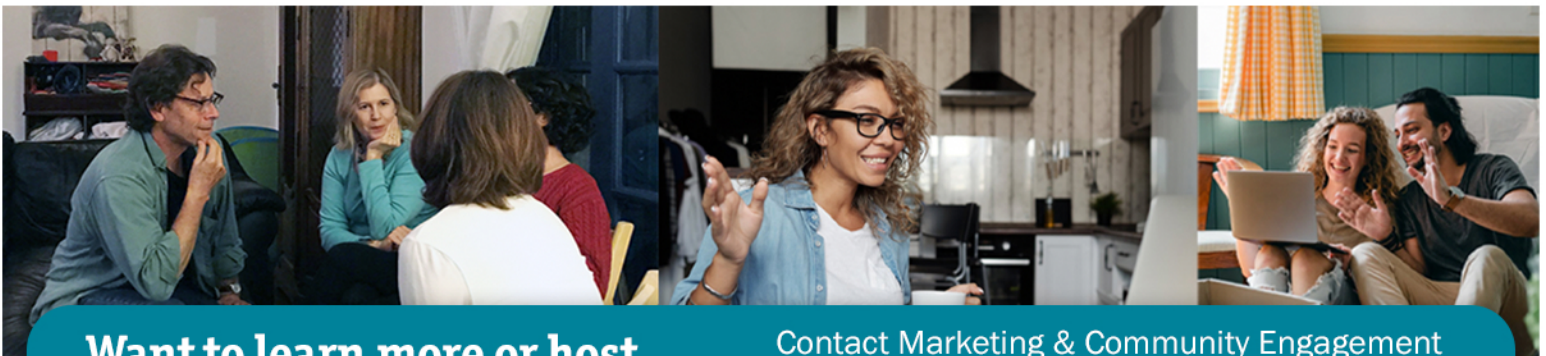


The Altadena Libraries will continue to keep in touch to share updates about the Community Conversations process, the final report synthesizing the feedback from the conversations across Altadena, and any additional resources that will be helpful to your neighborhood.

What Happens After?

The feedback received in the first 5-6 months of Community Conversations will be compiled into a report highlighting common themes from across the community that will be used by the Altadena Libraries to guide the planning of our services and offerings as well as upcoming library building projects. The report will also be shared with our community partners to help us reduce any duplication of efforts, share resources and talents, and deepen our connections to each other and Altadena.

We at the Altadena Libraries hope that neighbors will continue connecting with one another, and we will be checking in to offer even more ways to connect with the libraries and neighbors in the future!
