	Sheriff's Office is now open from 8-5 for walk-ins. Masks and social distancing rules still apply. Two County trailers are operational to track speed issues, and help with enforcement. Council member Wong asked about collision stats, but those figures were not available at that time.

3.2 Altadena Sheriff's Station Cpt. Jacobs

Current gang issues were discussed at a January 26 ACONA meeting, attended by Cpt. Jacobs. A representative from State Senator Portantino's office was also in attendance. Cpt. Jacobs said the meeting went well, and may be viewed on the ACONA website. She also reported on Loma Alta Park, and how its use as a shelter has come to an end. General crime is down for January (20% drop). However, there was a homicide on January 10 (2400 block of Lincoln Avenue). There were three strong-armed robberies. Cpt. Jacobs reiterated meeting at the Sheriff Station when conducting a transaction, especially where high-value items such as cell phones are involved. Gang violence has increased in Pasadena and Monrovia, particularly over the last weekend where there where six shootings in three days. Of note was the Pasadena shooting of a ten-year old, who was shot with a rifle. He will possibly lose an arm. There were two shootings in Monrovia. incidents have since tapered off. The catalytic converter thefts continue. She met with Pasadena PD and said that the gangs are very active right now.

Member Marcussen confirmed that Loma Alta has been taken off the 211 system. Member Wilkins asked about the primary source of income for gang members. Cpt. Jacobs replied that was anyone's guess, but that Covid was a definite factor in gangs increased activity. Member Wong mentioned gunshots near Loma Alta Drive, addressing resident concerns. She asked about motion-sensing lighting at the park. Cpt. Jacobs noted increased graffiti activity and property damage in the area, as well as gang shootings. She recommended the lights at the park shut off sooner than 10pm.

Member Marcussen asked Savannah Moore to look into the issue. Member Thomas clarified that the Peace Walk mentioned by Member Wong is leaving from Metropolitan Baptist Church.

Chairman Malone introduced Council member Knapp, who spoke of a screening of the documentary "Pasadena Exploring Solutions for Gang Violence", February 21.

3.3 Altadena Fire Maria Grycan

In January there was a total of 361 responses in Altadena, 286 of which were medical calls, with 208 patients transported. There were 6 fires, 9 traffic collisions. Member Wong inquired about how the Chaney Trail Fire started. The cause, as far as can be determined at this time, was fireworks. Any updates will be forwarded to the Council.

Dr. Cooper talked of various issues involving the business at 525 West Woodbury, and the effect on the adjacent school and neighborhood.

Chairman Malone clarified that comments and concerns can be addressed to Savannah Moore with the County. Council member Jones lauded Savannah Moore for her attention to the matter, and called for zoning issues to be addressed for her census tract. Member Arnzen voiced solidarity with CT 4610 by proposing a letter that calls the County to act. Council member Peck clarified that County has failed to address these longstanding issues. He also asked if a resolution from the Town Council to the County was possible.

4.2 NASA/JPL Groundwater Cleanup "Year in Review" _____Steve Slaten NASA Environmental Manager

Member Wong asked about the Arroyo Seco Canyon Project and the taking of water into spreading basins. The reply that the two projects are not related. Member Lyford asked about health impacts. Steve Slaten replied that the community is not exposed to any of these chemicals, being that they are hundreds of feet below ground.

4.3 Eaton Canyon Update/Parks______Sean Woods/Sam Estrada LA County Parks

Chairman Malone mentioned that public comments received relating to this topic have been forwarded in advance to the presenters, and will not be read tonight. They may be read at a later meeting.

Sam Estrada updated the Council on pickle ball courts and classes at Farnsworth Park. There will be a March 3 Zoom meeting, dealing with proposed operational changes at Eaton Canyon. Questions regarding Henninger Flats, Pinecrest Trail, Eaton Canyon, and related issues will be discussed at that time.

On January 28, Vision Zero hosted a virtual community meeting. Altadena has received two hundred (200) 'Slow Street' signs, the most of any unincorporated area of Los Angeles County. The signs have been moved to reduce damage to the signs. Loma Alta public sidewalk continues to move toward implementation. The idea is to provide safer space during Covid. A new stop sign was installed at Mariposa and Santa Anita. On February 25, a 'Safe Streets' Zoom meeting will be convened at 7pm.

8.1 Census Tract 4602:

Farnsworth Playground Replacement project meets again on March 4 and 6. Contact members Malone or Arnzen for more information. Chairman Malone mentioned new trees planted along Altadena Drive, near Santa Anita were a direct result of County response to community concerns regarding that stretch of road.

Member Wong referenced Chaney Trail Road stop signs approved by the LA County Board of Supervisors. Installation will commence within weeks. La Vina Connector Trail work is being done in phases, with the first starting in January. Completion is expected in two months. Member Wong detailed the 'Pop-up Sidewalk' demonstration project.

Member Aranda spoke of the cooperation with the Altadena Library regarding a virtual Census Tract 4610 Meeting for February 28 at 3pm. CT 4610 has contacted The Arts Council has been engaged in an effort to honor Charles White at the park that bears his name. Covid testing will commence at the Seven Day Adventist Church. Jackson Elementary has opted to change its name of its school, with further information following.
