	3.1 California Highway Patrol Officer Cooper
	There will be a new representative from CHP attending our meetings instead of Officer Cooper. His name is Officer Keller. In May another community office will be added so there will be two. As of July 1, 2021 you will have a point on your driver's license on your second and subsequent violation of distracted driving due to cell phone use.
	3.2 Altadena Sheriff's StationLt. Skaggs
	No member from Altadena Sheriff Station was present so Billy Malone reported info from Lt. Skaggs. Crime is down 10% from last year at this time. Biggest issue is theft of car parts. Please park your cars in your driveways, lock your cars.
	3.3. Altadena Fire Maria Grycan
	In March there was a total of 301 responses in Altadena, 243 of which were medical calls, with 198 patients transported. There was 1 fire, 2 gas leaks, 8 traffic collisions.

	4.1 LA County Regional Planning – Housing Element Zoning Update - Zoe Axelrod/Ayala Scott
	Department of Regional Planning explained the housing shortage and what will be included in the new Housing Element Proposal. Citizens will have an opportunity to provide comments when the draft is published.
	4.2. 2439-2445 Lincoln Avenue Senior Apartments Shonda Herold
	Affirmed Housing Group made a presentation about the building they will be building at the above address. The building will be 5 stories. That height will supersede the Altadena CSD because they are doing the project through a density bonus incentive. Half of the units will be reserved for very low-income seniors that have experienced homelessness. Construction will begin in the latter part of next year and open 2024. This project will go in by right so will not come before the ATC for recommendation to Regional Planning
