1.0 CALL TO ORDER 7:02pm

- 1.1 Flag Salute was led by Altadena Community Gardens and Christmas Tree Lane.
- 1.2 Councilmember Wong called role. Attending Victoria Knapp, Amy Lyford, Nic Arnzen, Billy Malone, Dorothy Wong, Hannah Petrie, Chris O'Malley, Veronica Jones, Darrell Aranda, Madalyn Barber, Alan Peck, Doug Colliflower, Reggie Wilkins, Sylvia Vega, Diane Marcussen. Councilmembers Dr. Sandra Thomas and Madalyn Barber were excused. Sylvia Vega was late. Alan Peck was not present. Moved forward with a quorum.
- 1.3 Vice Chair Knapp made motion to approve May 17th, 2022 meeting Agenda with the following changes; Additions of Altadena Historical Society Community Report, 4602 Census Tract report, and By Laws committee report. Unanimously approved with changes.

2.0 OFFICERS' REPORTS

- 2.1 Chair Veronica Jones called for increased community involvement in response to national mass shootings as well as increased awareness and the important of voting in elections.
- 2.2 Vice Chair Victoria Knapp reminded that May is AANHPI month.
- 2.3 Recording Secretary Nic Arnzen motioned to approve April 19, 2022 Minutes. Approved with one abstention of Reggie Wilkins
- 2.4 Treasurer Chris O'Malley reported that our balance was \$1871.19. \$13.90 deduction for website fee with GoDaddy.com. The current balance remains \$1857.29. Chair Jones made note of a resident who will be donating \$15 a month to the Council going forward.
- 2.5 Corresponding Secretary Wong made special announcements that can be seen on the ATC website.

3.0 PUBLIC SAFETY REPORTS

- 3.1 California Highway Patrol Officer Bay reported on collisions. 243 total collisions. 10 resulted in injuries, 2 were DUI investigations and arrest, and 3 hit and run. Seat belt enforcement day coming up and commercial enforcement day-enforcing commercial truck drivers' violations.
- 3.2 Sheriff Station Captain Williams introduced new supervisors Sergeant Mora and Sergeant Sandoval. Cpt. Williams reported crime continues downward trend, aggravated assault down 18% (violent crimes) and property crime is down 15%. Big spike in residential burglaries, most occur during the day. June 10th will be another Catalytic Converter etching event.
- 3.3 LA County Fire Rep. Maria Grycan reported on calls for paramedic services and fires for April. 302 service calls, 236 medical, transported 290 patients, 10 traffic collisions, 2 vs pedestrian (1 crosswalk, 1 moped). Brush inspections are happening.
