1. CALL TO ORDER 7:01pm

- 1.2 Councilmember Wong called role. Councilmembers Nic Arnzen, Diane Marcussen, Reginald Wilkins, and Hannah Petrie were excused. Moved forward with a guorum.
- 1.3 Vice Chair Knapp made motion to approve October 18th, 2022 meeting Agenda with the following changes; Scott Wardlaw will be presenting for Christmas Tree Lane Association and addition of Census Tract 4603.01.

- 2.3 Chair Jones, on behalf of Recording Secretary Nic Arnzen motioned to approve September 20th, 2022 Minutes. Approved unanimously with two abstentions.
- 2.4 Treasurer Chris O'Malley reported the September bank balance was \$898.56. Deducted expenses of \$13.99 deduction for website fee with GoDaddy.com, \$12 bank fee. The current balance is \$872.57.

- 4.1 California Highway Patrol Report by Officer Keller and Officer Boyd. August had 16 collisions, 4 involved injuries, 5 hit and run. September had 21 collisions, injuries in 6 of them, 7 hit and runs.
- 4.2 Altadena Sheriff's Station Captain Jabari Williams reported crime up 7% in assaults, down 6% in property crimes, vehicle crimes still up. Grand Theft Auto is down but break-ins for valuables are up. Continued increase in vehicle thefts on hiking trails.
- Thursday, October 27th 1-3 Robot Coffee, Conversation with the Captain. Same day between 5 and 8 Trunk or Treat at Farnsworth.
- October 29th Drug take back day at station 9am-12pm.
- 4.3 L.A. County Fire Altadena spokesperson Maria Grycan reported 359 responses, 272 medical, 203 transports, 9 traffic collisions, 5 fire calls (2 trash, 1 faulty electrical panel-just smoke, 1 loose air conditioning belt-just smoke, 1 residential building with minimal damage)
